


The Eucharistic Prayer A



It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth.

For you are the source of light and life; you made us in your image, and called us to new life in Jesus Christ our Lord.

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:



Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."



TODAY: Stewardship and Giving Sunday

Stewardship season has arrived! God's grace has guided us through an uncertain year thanks to a parish of generous, thoughtful doers. You willingly and quietly gave of your time and money to maintain the beauty of our services, the splendor of our music, the refurbishment of our organ, the conviviality of our fellowship, and the care of our neighbors.

Certainly, this past year has presented challenges to our world at St. Michael and All Angels. However, thanks to an industrious Finance Committee and Vestry, we now have two schools using our campus and contributing to our finances: The Gordon School and The OC Academy. These funds help offset our deficit, as we move into the new calendar year.

In October, you will be receiving your third quarter statement which includes year to date income and expenses for St. Michael's. Vestry, at the direction of Fr. Shane, implemented a zero-based budget for whole parish. Most met that goal through pledges, in-kind donations, and frugal spending. That effort coupled with tenant rents from the two schools, as well as Verizon, and Roger's Gardens currently gives us a projected year-end deficit of \$44,313.00 - well below the projected deficit of \$102,813.00. This lower deficit, although still not ideal, reflects the Parish Center Donations, increased plate donations, and pledges. The leadership of Fr. Shane, The Finance Committee and The Vestry has been very mindful of their roles as stewards of the resources you have generously entrusted to us.

Giving Sunday is TODAY, October 27, 2024. At that time, pledge cards will be collected at the Sunday liturgy or by mail or online. We ask you to prayerfully reflect on the gifts of this parish to you and your commitment to meet the financial cost of these gifts. We thank you for your generosity this year and hope that the same level of giving will prompt you to maintain or increase your pledge as able.

Little Red Wagon update

A note about pledging via credit card

If you pay your pledge via credit card, please consider including the processing fee in your payment. There is a drop down menu on the website to accommodate this inclusion. Currently, St. Michael's expects to pay \$1,600 by year's end for such fees.

Give via Qualified Charitable Distribution

Did you know that you can "avoid" paying taxes on all or a portion of your annual required minimum distribution (RMD) with a qualified charitable distribution (QCD)?

If you are 72 or older, and required to take an annual distribution from your IRA, 401(k), 403(b) etc. you can make a gift to St. Michael's (or any other qualified charity) to satisfy that obligation, and not pay income tax on the transfer, up to \$105,000 (adjusted annually). The distribution must come directly from your IRA to St. Michael's (to take advantage of this exception for a 401(k), the funds would need to be rolled over to an IRA first). The QCD can satisfy your required minimum distribution for the year up to \$105,000. The funds must come out of your account by the December 31st RMD deadline.

This is a great option for anyone who does not itemize charitable deductions and/or anyone who does not want to incur that additional RMD income. Since the gift doesn't count as income, it can actually reduce your annual income level, which in turn may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.

This exception is available to all individuals 70-1/2 or over, so you may be able to shelter up to \$105,000 in distributions from your IRA even if you are not yet subject to RMD requirements.

This available "loophole" is subject to specific technical requirements, so be sure to consult with your financial, tax and/or legal advisors before taking any action to ensure you're making the right decision for you and reporting the distribution correctly.
