




The Eucharistic Prayer B



It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth.

For in the multitude of your saints, you have surrounded us with a great cloud of witnesses, that we might rejoice in their fellowship, and run with endurance the race that is set before us; and, together with them, receive the crown of glory that never fades away.

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:



We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with St. Michael all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *AMEN*.



We Remember: All Souls' and Veterans' Day on November 10

You are warmly invited to join us at St. Michael and All Angels Episcopal Church in Corona del Mar on Sunday, November 10, 2024, as we honor both All Souls' Day and Veterans' Day in a special combined service.

For All Souls' Day, photographs of departed loved ones who have ever worshiped at St. Michael's will be displayed around the church, and we will light candles in their memory.

For Veterans' Day, we welcome all current and former service members to wear their uniforms and medals as we honor your service to our country.

A note about pledging via credit card

If you pay your pledge via credit card, please consider including the processing fee in your payment. There is a drop down menu on the website to accommodate this inclusion. Currently, St. Michael's expects to pay \$1,600 by year's end for such fees.

Give via Qualified Charitable Distribution

Did you know that you can "avoid" paying taxes on all or a portion of your annual required minimum distribution (RMD) with a qualified charitable distribution (QCD)?

If you are 72 or older, and required to take an annual distribution from your IRA, 401(k), 403(b) etc. you can make a gift to St. Michael's (or any other qualified charity) to satisfy that obligation, and not pay income tax on the transfer, up to \$105,000 (adjusted annually). The distribution must come directly from your IRA to St. Michael's (to take advantage of this exception for a 401(k), the funds would need to be rolled over to an IRA first). The QCD can satisfy your required minimum distribution for the year up to \$105,000. The funds must come out of your account by the December 31st RMD deadline.

This is a great option for anyone who does not itemize charitable deductions and/or anyone who does not want to incur that additional RMD income. Since the gift doesn't count as income, it can actually reduce your annual income level, which in turn may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.

This exception is available to all individuals 70-1/2 or over, so you may be able to shelter up to \$105,000 in distributions from your IRA even if you are not yet subject to RMD requirements.

This available "loophole" is subject to specific technical requirements, so be sure to consult with your financial, tax and/or legal advisors before taking any action to ensure you're making the right decision for you and reporting the distribution correctly.
