




First Sunday after Pentecost: Trinity Sunday



the Spirit.” ⁹Nicodemus said to him, “How can these things be?” ¹⁰Jesus answered him, “Are you

do not receive our testimony. ¹²If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe,

THE CREED (*Please stand as able.*)
