

JESUS SAID, "There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in a cloud' with power and great glory. Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near."

Then he told them a parable: "Look at the fig tree and all the trees; as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

"Be on guard so that your hearts are not weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and the worries of this life, and that day does not catch you unexpectedly, like a trap. For it will come upon all who live on the face of the whole earth. Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man."







Music Notes, by Dr. Ray Urwin



The tune of today's final hymn is attributed to John Francis Wade (c. 1710-1786). An English Roman Catholic, he spent much of his life at Douay, France, a center for Catholic exiles from England at the time. A music copyist and teacher of liturgical singing, he produced in the early 1740s a remarkable manuscript that is the source of two of our hymns; the other hymn is "O come, all ye faithful," perhaps the quintessential Christmas hymn. It is now generally assumed that Wade was the author of all the texts and tunes in this manuscript, including these two well-known hymns; but there is no direct evidence of his authorship, thus the abbreviation "att.," attributed to. (from *The Hymnal 1982 Companion*)

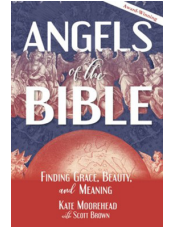

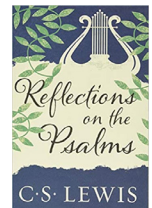
