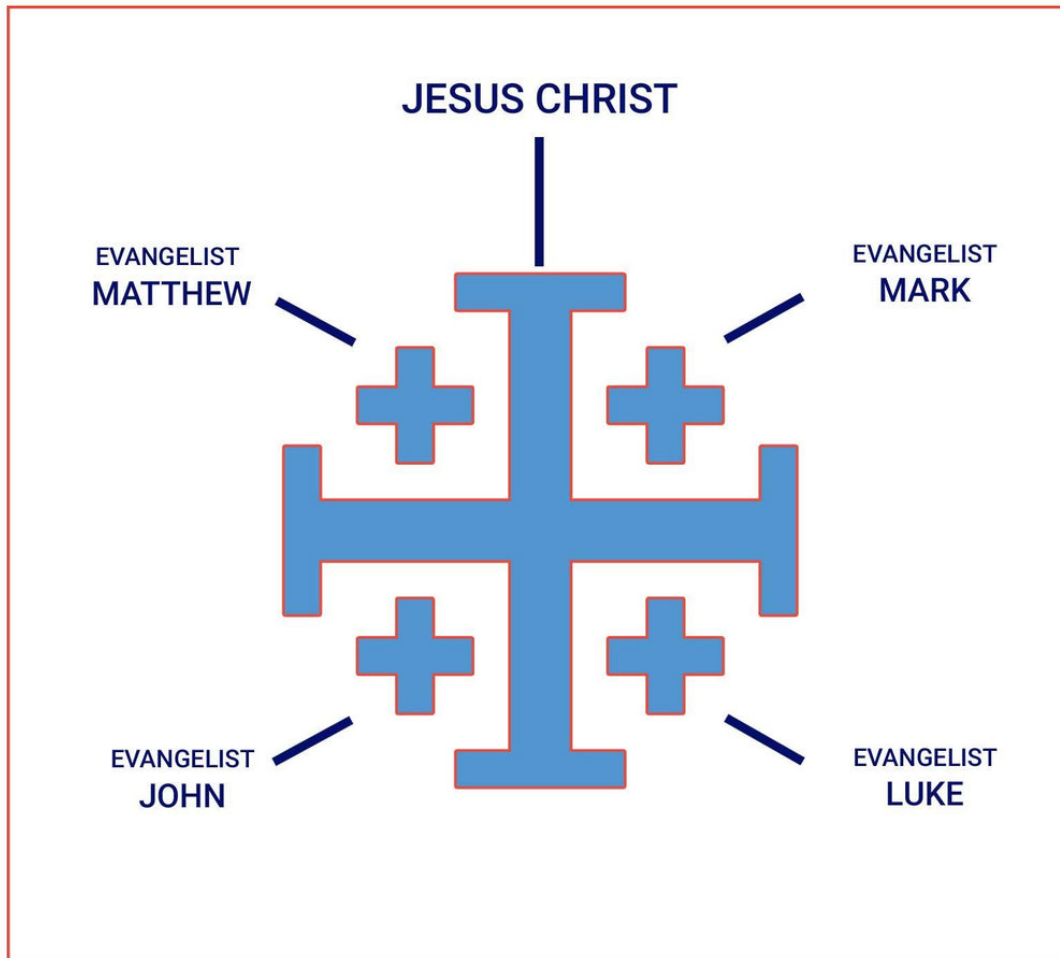

Please remember St Michael’s in your prayers and we hope you will return to worship with us again!


