


### The Eucharistic Prayer D (Book of Common Prayer)



It is truly right to glorify you, Father, and to give you thanks; for you alone are God, living and true, dwelling in light inaccessible from before time and for ever.

Fountain of life and source of all goodness, you made all things and fill them with your blessing; you created them to rejoice in the splendor of your radiance.

Countless throngs of angels stand before you to serve you night and day; and, beholding the glory of your presence, they offer you unceasing praise. Joining with them, and giving voice to every creature under heaven, we acclaim you, and glorify your Name, as we say,



We acclaim you, holy Lord, glorious in power. Your mighty works reveal your wisdom and love. You formed us in your own image, giving the whole world into our care, so that, in obedience to you, our Creator, we might rule and serve all your creatures. When our disobedience took us far from you, you did not abandon us to the power of death. In your mercy you came to our help, so that in seeking you we might find you. Again and again you called us into covenant with you, and through the prophets you taught us to hope for salvation.

Father, you loved the world so much that in the fullness of time you sent your only Son to be our Savior. Incarnate by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, he lived as one of us, yet without sin. To the poor he proclaimed the good news of salvation; to prisoners, freedom; to the sorrowful, joy. To fulfill your purpose he gave himself up to death; and, rising from the grave, destroyed death, and made the whole creation new.

And, that we might live no longer for ourselves, but for him who died and rose for us, he sent the Holy Spirit, his own first gift for those who believe, to complete his work in the world, and to bring to fulfillment the sanctification of all.

When the hour had come for him to be glorified by you, his heavenly Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end; at supper with them he took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you. This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Father, we now celebrate this memorial of our redemption. Recalling Christ's death and his descent among the dead, proclaiming his resurrection and ascension to your right hand, awaiting his coming in glory; and offering to you, from the gifts you have given us, this bread and this cup, we praise you and we bless you.

Lord, we pray that in your goodness and mercy your Holy Spirit may descend upon us, and upon these gifts, sanctifying them and showing them to be holy gifts for your holy people, the bread of life and the cup of salvation, the Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ.

Grant that all who share this bread and cup may become one body and one spirit, a living sacrifice in Christ, to the praise of your Name.

Remember, Lord, your one holy catholic and apostolic Church, redeemed by the blood of your Christ. Reveal its unity, guard its faith, and preserve it in peace.

And grant that we may find our inheritance with [the Blessed Virgin Mary, with patriarchs, prophets, apostles, and martyrs, with Saint Michael and All Angels, and with all the saints who have found favor with you in ages past. We praise you in union with them and give you glory through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, all honor and glory are yours, Almighty God and Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, for ever and ever. *AMEN*

### Introduction to Stewardship Season

Stewardship season has arrived! God's grace has guided us through another year, and we are truly grateful for the parish community at St. Michaels and All Angels. Our congregation is composed of generous and thoughtful individuals who consistently step up to support our church. Through your willingness and quiet dedication, you have contributed both time and money, helping to preserve the beauty of our worship services, the magnificence of our music, the warmth of our fellowship, and the well-being of our broader community.

#### Facing Challenges and Embracing Opportunities

This year has not been without its financial challenges for our parish. However, through the diligent work of the Finance Committee and Vestry, we have continued to host The Gordon School on our campus and have welcomed The Seashore Academy this fall. These leases are a vital revenue stream that helps us plan our next budget accordingly.

#### Financial Stewardship and Campus Ministries

The Vestry remains committed to implementing a zero-based budget for campus ministries, relying on pledges and in-kind donations to support these efforts. In addition to the valuable rental income from the two schools, our campus continues to benefit from relationships with Verizon and Roger's Gardens, both of which help to further reduce our deficit. Additional sources of support include Parish Center Donations, increased weekly plate offerings, and ongoing pledges. You can be assured that Fr. Shane, the Finance Committee, and the Vestry are steadfast in their responsibility to steward the resources entrusted to them.

#### Giving Sunday and Your Commitment

Giving Sunday will take place on November 2nd, 2025. On that day—or beforehand—pledge cards will be collected during the service, or you may submit them by mail or online. We encourage you to prayerfully consider the many gifts this parish has provided to you, and to reflect on your own commitment to supporting the financial costs associated with those blessings. We sincerely thank you for your generosity throughout this year and hope you will continue to maintain or increase your pledge as you are able.

#### Give via Qualified Charitable Distribution

Did you know that you can "avoid" paying taxes on all or a portion of your annual required minimum distribution (RMD) with a qualified charitable distribution (QCD)?

If you are 72 or older, and required to take an annual distribution from your IRA, 401(k), 403(b) etc. you can make a gift to St. Michael's (or any other qualified charity) to satisfy that obligation, and not pay income tax on the transfer, up to \$108,000 (adjusted annually). The distribution must come directly from your IRA to St. Michael's (to take advantage of this exception for a 401(k), the funds would need to be rolled over to an IRA first). The QCD can satisfy your required minimum distribution for the year up to \$108,000. The funds must come out of your account by the December 31st RMD deadline.

This is a great option for anyone who does not itemize charitable deductions and/or anyone who does not want to incur that additional RMD income. Since the gift doesn't count as income, it can actually reduce your annual income level, which in turn may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.

This exception is available to all individuals 70-1/2 or over, so you may be able to shelter up to \$105,000 in distributions from your IRA even if you are not yet subject to RMD requirements. This available "loophole" is subject to specific technical requirements, so be sure to consult with your financial, tax and/or legal advisors before taking any action to ensure you're making the right decision for you and reporting the distribution correctly.

It's that time of year again when our parish comes together to make the holidays brighter for a local family in need. This year, thanks to Mary Bailey's outreach to **MOMS OC**, we've been paired with a family of six—a mother, father, and four children (ages 13, 11, 4, and 6 months).

The parents have requested **Walmart gift cards**, and the children would love **Target gift cards**. We'll be collecting donations through **Sunday**, **December 14**, so we can deliver the gift cards by the end of the month.
