



The man said to Rebekah and her household, ³⁴“I am Abraham’s servant. ³⁵The LORD has greatly blessed my master, and he has become wealthy; he has given him flocks and herds, silver and gold, male and female slaves, camels and donkeys. ³⁶And Sarah my master’s wife bore a son to my master when she was old; and he has given him all that he has. ³⁷My master made me swear, saying, ‘You shall not take a wife for my son from the daughters of the Canaanites, in whose land I live; ³⁸but you shall go to my father’s house, to my kindred, and get a wife for my son.’

⁴²“I came today to the spring, and said, ‘O LORD, the God of my master Abraham, if now you will only make successful the way I am going!’ ⁴³I am standing here by the spring of water; let the young woman who comes out to draw, to whom I shall say, “Please give me a little water from your jar to drink,” ⁴⁴and who will say to me, “Drink, and I will draw for your camels also”—let her be the woman whom the LORD has appointed for my master’s son.’

⁴⁵“Before I had finished speaking in my heart, there was Rebekah coming out with her water jar on her shoulder; and she went down to the spring, and drew. I said to her, ‘Please let me drink.’ ⁴⁶She quickly let down her jar from her shoulder, and said, ‘Drink, and I will also water your camels.’ So I drank, and she also watered the camels. ⁴⁷Then I asked her, ‘Whose daughter are you?’ She said, ‘The daughter of Bethuel, Nahor’s son, whom Milcah bore to him.’ So I put the ring on her nose, and the bracelets on her arms. ⁴⁸Then I bowed my head and worshiped the LORD, and blessed the LORD, the God of my master Abraham, who had led me by the right way to obtain the daughter of my master’s kinsman for his son. ⁴⁹Now then, if you will deal loyally and truly with my master, tell me; and if not, tell me, so that I may turn either to the right hand or to the left.”

⁵⁸And they called Rebekah, and said to her, “Will you go with this man?” She said, “I will.”

⁵⁹So they sent away their sister Rebekah and her nurse along with Abraham’s servant and his men. ⁶⁰And they blessed Rebekah and said to her,

“May you, our sister, become
thousands of myriads;
may your offspring gain possession
of the gates of their foes.”

⁶¹Then Rebekah and her maids rose up, mounted the camels, and followed the man; thus the servant took Rebekah, and went his way.

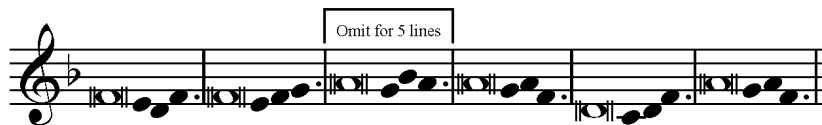

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

Living Generously | Pentecost 6 - Matthew 11:16-19, 25-30

Our relationship to rest is complicated. There are seasons in life and in society when rest seems nearly impossible. We cannot rest in any work of lasting value. We must rely on our inner reserves, the support of others, and the grace of God to keep going. But our bodies need daily rest or we get sick. Our minds need rest or we can no longer think straight. Our souls need rest or we lose grounding and perspective.

God knows that we all need rest in daily measure; in longer rhythms of sabbath time each week; and in restorative seasons when we can allow ourselves, like the soil, to lie fallow in order to continue to bear fruit. In your times of rest, pray for those who are still working and, when you can, find ways to offer rest for others. The gift of rest is priceless, both to give and to receive.

Sunday Forum on July 19: Addiction and Recovery

Bob Weathers will continue the adult education series with a session on **July 19 at 11 a.m.** on how addiction works, how recovery restores the feeling of being alive, and how the Gospel frames the emotions of this journey. He has written two short (30-page) books on these topics: "From Comfortably Numb to Fully Alive" and "From the Far Country to the Feast" and would be happy to provide parishioners with copies if they wish to read the books before the session. "Mass for Troubled Times" on St. Michael's Day: Sunday, September 27

For the Feast of St. Michael and All Angels, our Sunday morning liturgy will feature *Missa in Angustiis* ("Nelson Mass") by Joseph Haydn. Composed in 1798 during a time of political uncertainty in Europe, Haydn's *Missa in Angustiis* ("Mass for troubled times") reflects both tension and hope. The work later became associated with Battle of the Nile and the victory of British Admiral Horatio Nelson, from which it gained its popular name, the Nelson Mass. Widely regarded as one of Haydn's greatest sacred works, the Mass is notable for its dramatic intensity, powerful choral writing, and brilliant interplay between soloists and orchestra.
